Cemara Rompes - Lombok Weavers' Craft (CMR) is a fair-trade textile coop located in Pringgasela Village on Lombok, Indonesia. We cheer diverse lives of the locals and visitors in three steps: (1) Collect exquisite traditional **textiles**; (2) Brocade **fashion** accessories for everyday use; (3) Enhance **eco-friendly lifestyles**.

In our gallery, you can find exquisite handwoven textiles such as *sarong* and *selendang*, best for customers who seek fresh fabrics to tailor at home. Aside from these raw materials, some of the textiles are made into *shawls*, *hijabs*, *bags* and more. We also welcome requests from individuals and organisations to craft *custom-design textiles*.

The name 'cemara rompes' ('fir trees' in the Sasak language) represents our hope to grow tall and stand straight like the fir trees on the holy mountain of Rinjani.

# Why Fair-Trade?

We believe in the power of balance and harmony.

CMR aims to achieve the unique **social design** to empower village women and sustain the local culture of weaving by enhancing the market value of the craft.

Our fair-trade policy encourages the **fair payment** to the weavers and tailors, and promotes **natural dyes** and **thread recycling**. As a small coop, we are not yet able to fully control the original cotton qualities. This is because we do not employ any weavers in securing their autonomy to choose when to work and where to sell the products. Consequently, it is up to individual women to use what kind of threads. However, we eagerly aim to reach for cotton companies and improve the production's transparency in the future. Thank you!

In Pringgasela, the **textile design process** typically begins with individual women improvising the colours and patterns of weaving. Their handwoven textiles are typically brought to and sometimes sought by the CMR founder who the weavers call as 'anaku (my child)' or 'papuku (my grandchild)' and interact on a daily basis.

Indonesia is known for a wide variety of weaving cultures, and the delicate handiwork of Pringgasela textiles preserve the best of its multi-layered processes such as thread-dying and patterning. All the approx. 900 local weavers use the ancient back-strap looms that developed in Indonesia from 2-3 century B.C.





CMR's mission is to preserve the **high-quality weaving skills** and **empower the women** financially and socially by promoting the market value of the textiles. Therefore, we apply a fair-trade policy with the strategic design focus on the **friendliness to people and the planet**.
